Principal Update

Dear Parents, Carers, and School Community

It was wonderful to see the joy on student faces with our recent Mother's Day Spa. An opportunity for lots of oral language between young and old made our mums and grandmas feel very special.

The Harlin SS Athletics Day is Wednesday, 14 June with Thursday, 15 June as a back-up day in case of rain. Families are invited to line the oval fence with a shade shelter, comfortable chairs and loud voices. Our P-2 class were busy on Friday afternoon with modified discus and shot-put. A "sticky arm" was our focus for shot-put and once we get that sticky arm attached to our ear, we know we were on a clear winner for a put rather that a throw. The discus was also successful as we learnt to move it quickly to avoid the disc falling from our grasp. Year 3-6 moved from the training elastic to the bar for high jump. Equally important is the trailing leg. The toe needs to be level with the nose to avoid the trailing leg knocking the bar. We finished with Star Relay of which you will be invited to participate against our house teams. Age champion medals and a House Shield will be presented. A full program will be sent home soon and we hope families will be able to attend. Congratulations to Carlarni Peters and Adelaide Thallon who were voted as House Captains. Staff have decided to go to Toogoolawah SS for our combined Athletics Carnival this year, where students will also compete against Linville SS. The event will be on Friday, June 16. Based on times, distances and heights, students will then be selected for the District Carnival.

Both Mrs Enks and myself are setting up QParents which provides instant messaging for absences and permission forms. 


